how can we create writing instruction that allows latine youth to desahogarse where writing is a release how can we learn more about latinx youth and the issues that matter to them so that we can all reimagine a better world in narrative writing with latinx teens testimonios texts and teaching dr carla espallá introduces the writing for desahogo teaching framework a foundation for twenty writing lessons that immerse students in texts on topics that include im migration mental health language resilience and community to facilitate their discussions and writing inspired by research with latinx teens and young adults dr espallá bookends each chapter with the words of latinx youth and testimonios by latinx educators while inviting teachers to share in the vulnerability of writing to heal with her own creative writing expanding on these topics poems and narratives give readers a lens into dr espallá s particular experience while setting up teacher and student text sets as entry points into the topic of study each chapter s lesson sequences include four text types for study multimedia

effective narration the telling of stories or recounting of personal experiences is an art requiring skills that appear crucial for children s language development and literacy acquisition this volume serves an important purpose because it pulls together the widely scattered literature in the field exploring the ways in which oral narrative structure develops in children and how it may be facilitated it presents new empirical studies on genres of narrative the role narrative structure plays in emergent literacy the relationship between narrative language and autobiographical memory and ways in which teachers and parents facilitate or hinder children s narrative development the empirical research presented here draws from diverse groups including hispanic african american and anglo american children from rural and urban america and canada

inside the writing portfolio addresses the primacy of teacher knowledge in the portfolio process it seeks to answer such questions as what do we need to know in order to assess the personal narratives stories and nonfiction pieces that children choose for their portfolios how do we mark their progress what do we need to know to assess the conventions of spelling punctuation and handwriting how do we assess children s self assessment insights and their goals for future learning jenkins makes the case for the collaborative portfolio one that merges the selections reflections and goals of both the child and the teacher she takes the stance that if portfolio assessment is to stand as a viable alternative to standardized measures it is essential to capture the insights of both child and teacher in order to illuminate the full extent of a child s learning past present and future jenkins walks us through the collaborative portfolio of third grader shane and then follows his progress through grades four and five research findings are presented in conjunction with shane s writing record writing samples excerpts from his interviews and surveys and other materials jenkins also analyzes additional work from younger and older children to illustrate the development of writing across a broad age range she completes the assessment picture with writing samples from home highlighting the expansive nature of literacy

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
