animals as it merely attributes human characteristics to beasts in an attempt to teach humanist ideals scholars and writers continually turned to the animal world for reflection despite this scientists of the period used animals for empirical and medical knowledge recognizing biological and spiritual similarities but refusing to renege human superiority including an insightful reexamination of ben jonson s volpone and fascinating looks at works by francis bacon edward coke and richard overton among others fudge probes issues of animal ownership and biological and spiritual superiority in early modern england that resonate with philosophical quandaries still relevant in contemporary society
