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the third international mathematics and science study timss covered five different grade levels with more than 40 countries collecting data in more than 30 different languages more than a million students were tested the present report contains the timss results for students in the final year of secondary school mathematics and science literacy achievement results are reported for 21 countries

advanced mathematics results and physics results respectively are reported for 16 countries these results complete the first round of descriptive reports from the timss study together with the results for primary school students third and fourth grade in most countries and middle school students seventh and eighth grades in most countries the results contained in this report provide valuable information about the relative effectiveness of a country s education system as students progress through school a ten page executive summary details the extensive conclusions to be drawn from the study dozens of tables and figures provide detailed statistics for all participating countries the netherlands and sweden were the top performing countries in mathematics france was the top performer in advanced mathematics norway and sweden had physics achievement levels significantly higher than other participating countries the appendixes contain extensive information pertaining to the development of the timss tests sample sizes and participation rates compliance with sampling guidelines and the test curriculum matching analysis ddr

this report describes the growth in cognitive skills and achievement and the continuities and discontinuities experienced in school and at home by the eighth grade cohort of the national education longitudinal study of 1988 nels 88 during the 2 years between the study's base year 1988 and the first followup 1990 surveys the report examines school change in view of the almost universally experienced transition to high school with findings about patterns of school transition and changes in students' perceptions of safety and overall learning environment major changes in home life and family are also outlined finally the report examines the tested achievement of the cohort by exploring gains and the content areas in which they occurred by the followup about 6 of the students were no longer in school and half reported that they left simply because they did not like school in terms of simple achievement gains students gained in all four subject categories of science mathematics social studies and reading comprehension although gain patterns were complex data from nels 88 and its followups are a rich source of information for policy makers and education practitioners four appendixes discuss standard errors research methodology an overview of the program and an annotated bibliography of 30 nels 88 publications contains 14 tables 40 figures and 70 references author sld

never before have americans been so anxious about the future of their society but rarely has anyone offered a clear statement about why in a nation so prosperous free and stable we tend to assume that the country is in dire straits and that the government can do little to help this book is just such a statement an eloquent assessment of where america stands how our society has changed in the past half century and who or what is responsible for our current frustrations derek bok examines the nation's progress in five areas that americans generally consider to be of paramount importance economic prosperity quality of life opportunity personal security and societal values he shows that although we are better off today in most areas than we were in 1960 we have performed poorly overall compared with other leading industrial nations and when it comes to providing adequate health care at a reasonable cost educating our young people for high skilled jobs alleviating poverty and urban blight and reducing crime our record has been dismal comparing the united states with other leading industrial nations on more than sixty key indicators bok shows that we rank below average in more than two thirds of the cases and at the bottom in more than half what has caused this decline and what can be done about it in virtually all important areas of american life bok concludes government policies have played a significant often decisive

role in accounting for our successes as well as our failures but whereas others call for downsizing the federal government bok argues that government is essential to achieving america s goals in short ronald reagan was only half right government is the problem but it is also the most important part of the solution by assessing the state of the nation and identifying the reasons for its current condition this book helps set the agenda for improving america s performance in the future
