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Robert A. M. Stern is one of contemporary architecture's most influential figures with a career encompassing every facet of the profession. He has a flourishing private practice, he is a noted authority on New York architectural history, his own architectural work has been featured in numerous monographs, and as dean of the Yale School of Architecture, he has undeniably shaped the field of architectural education as a preeminent force in the discourse of the field. Stern was one of the first critics to use and analyze the term postmodern in architecture. This collection of essays, Stern's first, brackets the years defined by the changes in architectural thinking introduced by Robert Venturi in 1966 and the exhibition Deconstructivist Architecture at the Museum of Modern Art in 1988. Throughout, Stern provides close readings of architectural events and offers firsthand accounts of transformations in architectural thinking during a critical period.

these readings are organized into four sections the first explores the wellsprings of the debates in the relationship between the postmodern and the enterprise it both continues and contravenes modernism here philosophers social and political commentators as well as cultural and literary analysts present controversial background essays on the complex history of postmodernism the readings in the second section debate the possibility or desirability of trying to define the postmodern given its cultural agenda of decentering challenging even undermining the guiding master narratives of western culture the readings in the third section explore postmodernism's complicated complicity with these very narratives while the fourth section moves from theory to practice in order to investigate in a variety of fields the common denominators of the postmodern condition in action

having made his reputation in the 1940s and 50s arthur miller continued to write into the twenty first century producing his final play in 2004 the year before his death with little critical academic or theatrical attention being paid to his plays after 1968 is the price he had one of the longest late periods in literary history this book brings new attention to miller's writing from this period analysing 5 plays the archbishop's ceiling some kind of love story clara and the ride down mt morgan resurrection blues and a host of essays to highlight the influence of postmodernism on his work using relevant novels and films these plays are situated within the context of their cultural moments to show that miller remained an engaged aware and contemporary writer until his death

since its first appearance in 1981 critical regionalism has enjoyed a celebrated worldwide reception the 1990s increased its pertinence as an architectural theory that defends the cultural identity of a place resisting the homogenising onslaught of globalisation today its main principles such as acknowledging the climate history materials culture and topography of a specific place are integrated in architects education across the globe but at the same time the richer cross cultural history of critical regionalism has been reduced to schematic juxtapositions of the global with the local retrieving both the globalising branches and the overlooked cross cultural roots of critical regionalism resisting postmodern architecture resituates critical regionalism within the wider framework of debates around postmodern architecture the diverse contexts from which it emerged and the cultural media complex that conditioned its reception in so doing it explores the intersection of three areas of growing historical and theoretical interest postmodernism critical regionalism and globalisation based on more than 50 interviews and previously unpublished archival material from six countries the book transgresses existing barriers to integrate sources in other languages into anglophone architectural scholarship in so doing it shows how the periphery was not just a passive recipient but also an active generator of architectural theory and practice stylianos giamarellos challenges long held central notions of supposedly international discourses of the recent past and outlines critical regionalism as an unfinished project apposite for the 21st century on the fronts of architectural theory history and historiography

the concepts of modernism and postmodernism constitute the single most dominant issue of twentieth century literature and culture and are the cause of much debate in this influential volume peter brooker presents some of the key viewpoints from a variety of major critics and sets these additionally alongside challenging arguments from third

world black and feminist perspectives his excellent introduction and detailed headnotes for each section and essay provide an indispensable guide to interpreting the many different opinions and prove to be valuable contributions in their own right

postmodernism in the visual arts is not just another ism it emerged in the 1960s as a transformation of artistic creativity inspired by duchamp s idea that the artwork does not have to be physically made by its creator products of mass culture and technology can be used just as well as traditional media this idea became influential because of a widespread naturalization of technology where technology becomes something lived in as well as used postmodern art embodies this attitude to explain why paul crowther investigates topics such as eclecticism the sublime deconstruction in art and philosophy and paolozzi s wittgenstein inspired works

garish churches gabled panel blocks neo historical tenements this book is about these and other architectural oddities that emerged in poland between 1975 and 1989 a period characterised by the decline of the authoritarian socialist regime and waves of political protest during that period committed architects defied repressive politics and persistent shortages and designed houses and churches which adapted eclectic historical forms and geometric volumes and were based on traditional typologies these buildings show a very different background of postmodernism far removed from the debates over robert venturi philip johnson or prince charles in western europe and north america a context in which postmodern architecture stood not for world weary irony in an economically saturated society but for individualised counter propositions to a collectivist ideology for a yearning for truth and spiritual values and for a discourse on distinctiveness and national identity postmodern architecture in socialist poland argues that this new architecture marked the beginning of socio political transformation and at the same time showed postmodernism s reconciliatory potential in light of massive historical ruptures and wartime destruction these buildings successfully responded to the contradictory desires for historical continuity and acknowledgment of rupture and loss next to international ideas the architects took up domestic traditions such as the ideas of the polish school of historic conservation and long standing national patriotic narratives they thus contributed to the creation of a built environment and intellectual climate that have been influential to date this book will be of great interest to students and scholars interested in postmodern architecture and urban design as well as in the socio cultural background and transformative potential of architecture under socialism

colquhoun graduated from the architectural association in 1949 currently professor emeritus of architecture at princeton university he has taught at the aa cornell university and university college dublin among many other schools of architecture he is the author of several books including the seminal essays in architectural criticism 1981 modernity and the classical tradition 1991 both republished here in their entirety and the oxford history of modern architecture 2002 this book includes essays from throughout colquhoun s distinguished career in his early writing colquhoun subjects modern architecture to a far more thorough reading than was then customary his meticulous evaluation of modernism raised the standard of architectural historiography and has influenced new directions in theory and practice ever since collected essays in architectural criticism encompasses the clarity of style and rigorous erudite analysis that colquhoun has brought to bear on a diverse range of subjects including le corbusier robert venturi and denise scott brown the pompidou centre postmodernism and the design of museums

analyzes the intersections between feminist politics and postmodern aesthetics as demonstrated in recent anglo american fiction

postmodernism became the buzzword of contemporary society in the 1990s yet even now it still remains confusing and baffling in its variety of definitions contexts and associations beginning postmodernism aims to offer clear accessible and step by step introductions to postmodernism across a wide range of subjects it encourages readers to explore how the debates about postmodernism have emerged from basic philosophical and cultural ideas and to develop comparative connections and ideas from one area to another with its emphasis firmly on postmodernism in practice the book contains questions designed to help readers understand and reflect upon a variety of positions within the following areas of contemporary culture philosophy and cultural theory architecture and concepts of space visual art sculpture and material culture popular culture and music film video and television and the social sciences

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
