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the figure of the vampire serves as both object and mode of analysis for more than a century of hollywood filmmaking never dying shifting shape and moving at unnatural speed as the vampire renews itself by drinking victims blood so too does hollywood renew itself by consuming foreign styles and talent moving to overseas locations and proliferating in new guises in vampires race and transnational hollywoods dale hudson explores the movement of transnational hollywood s vampires between low budget quickies and high budget franchises as it appropriates visual styles from german mexican and hong kong cinemas and off shores to canada philippines and south africa as the vampire s popularity has swelled vampire film and television has engaged with changing discourses around race and identity not always addressed in realist modes here teen vampires comfort misunderstood youth chador wearing skateboarder vampires promote transnational feminism african american and mexican american vampires recover their repressed histories looking at contemporary hits like true blood twilight underworld and the strain classics such as universal s dracula and dracula and miscegenation melodramas like the cheat and the sheik the book reconfigures hollywood historiography and tradition as fundamentally transnational offering fresh interpretations of vampire media as trans genre sites for political contestation

from the beginning horror has been part of the cinema landscape despite some of the earliest genre films with gay directors such as f w murnau nosferatu and james whale frankenstein the invisible man bride of frankenstein lgbtqia characters have rarely been portrayed in full view for decades filmmakers have included coded content in their films with the homosexual experience translated into censor friendly subtext for consumption by general audiences gradually lgbtqia characters and themes have moved from

dreadful pleasures offers a lively look at those stories that make our hair stand on end their persistence in our culture their manifestations in art and our need for the frissons they provide james twitchell traces our fascination with horror from the cave paintings at lascaux to the slasher movies today twitchell finds that three particular stories have had a special resonance in our culture the bloodsucker dracula the deformed creature frankenstein and the transformation monster the wolfman dr jekyll and mr hyde why have these stories persisted to the point of becoming mythic and to the exclusion of others whatever happened to the phantom of the opera or the hunchback of notre dame or the creature from the black lagoon using a psychoanalytic approach twitchell argues that the stories we seek out and preserve are the ones that carry certain information as well as horror these myths he contends warn their adolescent audiences of the dangers of careless sexual behavior they seem to say subliminally that sex itself is not horrible but sex with certain people is whether discussing the engravings of william hogarth or the texas chainsaw massacre twitchell is consistently insightful provocative and entertaining film buffs and scholars literary critics and devotees of the gothic novel will all welcome this study about the author james b twitchell is professor of
