this book presents a study and catalogue of the early christian stone architectural decorations from the negev desert israel this work is based on the largest sample of decorated architectural elements from the byzantine negev 4th 7th century ce to have been comparatively studied the analysis provides a key for the characteristics of these aniconic carved decorations and an in depth examination of their symbolic meaning

paramount in the shaping of early byzantine identity was the construction of the church of hagia sophia in constantinople 532 537 ce this book examines the edifice from the perspective of aesthetics to define the concept of beauty and the meaning of art in early byzantium byzantine aesthetic thought is re evaluated against late antique neoplatonism and the writings of pseudo dionysius that offer fundamental paradigms for the late antique attitude towards art and beauty these metaphysical concepts of aesthetics are ultimately grounded in experiences of sensation and perception and reflect the ways in which the world and reality were perceived and grasped signifying the cultural identity of early byzantium there are different types of aesthetic data those present in the aesthetic object and those found in aesthetic responses to the object this study looks at the aesthetic data embodied in the sixth century architectural structure and interior decoration of hagia sophia as well as in literary responses ekphrasis to the building the purpose

of the byzantine ekphrasis was to convey by verbal means the same effects that the artefact itself would have caused a literary analysis of these rhetorical descriptions recaptures the byzantine perception and expectations and at the same time reveals the cognitive processes triggered by the great church the central aesthetic feature that emerges from sixth century ekphraseis of hagia sophia is that of light light is described as the decisive element in the experience of the sacred space and light is simultaneously associated with the notion of wisdom it is argued that the concepts of light and wisdom are interwoven programmatic elements that underlie the unique architecture and non figurative decoration of hagia sophia a similar concern for the phenomenon of light and its epistemological dimension is reflected in other contemporary monuments testifying to the pervasiveness of these aesthetic values in early byzantium

architectural sculpture and liturgical furniture are key genres of late antique and byzantine archaeology and art and this book provides the first general overview it offers two alternative ways of access via technical terms and illustrations it can thus serve as dictionary if a term requires explanation and illustration or as a visual gazetteer for the research of artefacts in addition the volume can also serve as an academic textbook

the islamic world drew upon a myriad of pre existing styles of fortification taking romano byzantine indian and chinese ideas to create a highly effective and sophisticated hybrid fortification that was both new and distinctive this book examines early saracen fortifications covering their historical background socio political circumstances and their role in protecting industry trade and the frontiers of the islamic world from the mayyad castles in the desert of jordan and syria to the round city of baghdad and the great gates of cairo this book provides an insight into the majesty of the saracen forts illustrated with specially commissioned artwork and cutaways together with photographs of period engravings and images of the sites today

it has long been an accepted assumption that the abstracted mode of visual representation that emerged in late antiquity reflected a collective shift from the outer directed and material world view of classical antiquity to an inner directed spiritual mentality informed by christianity the purpose of this volume is to offer a more nuanced and diverse image of the nature and meanings of abstraction and symbolism in late antique and early medieval art beyond normative intepretation

models and from a number of different methodological and interpretative perspectives in ten chapters ten authors specialised in various fields of late antique and byzantine art explore the historiographical background of the spiritual interpretation paradigm neuroscientific and theological dimensions of christian visual aesthetics meanings and motive factors behind apparently wholly abstract and aniconic compositions symbolic motifs and schemes for visualising cosmic order and the cosmic state of christ and the re use of symbolic greco roman themes in christian contexts the result is a multi focal image of late antique abstraction and symbolism that illuminates the heterogeneity and complexity of the phenomena and of their study
