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this book explores the relationship between contemporary theatre particularly contemporary theatre directors and the dramatic canon of plays through focusing on productions of plays by three canonical playwrights shakespeare ibsen and brecht by eight contemporary european directors michael buffong joe hill gibbins and emma rice from the uk christopher rüping from germany thorleifur orn arnarsson from iceland and kjeriski hom alexander mork eidem and sigrid ström reibo from norway the book investigates why and how the theatre continues to engage with canonical plays in particular the book questions the political and cultural implications of theatrical reproductions of the literary

canon drawing on Chantal Mouffe's theories of agonism and critical art the book investigates whether theatrical reproduction of the canon always reconstitutes the hegemonic values and ideologies of the canon or whether theatrical interventions in the canon can challenge such values and ideologies and thereby also challenge the dominant ideologies and hegemonies of contemporary culture and society this study will be of great interest to academics and students in drama and theatre particularly those who work with theatre in the twenty first century directors theatre and the political impact of theatre

this popular rhetoric reader combines a brief accessible introduction to argument with an anthology of provocative readings on contemporary issues by stressing the rhetorical situation and the audience this rhetoric avoids complicated schemes and terminology in favor of providing students with the practical means to find good reasons for the positions they want to advocate to their audiences good reasons with contemporary arguments helps students write and understand various types of arguments including visual as well as verbal arguments supporting the authors instruction are numerous readings by professional and student writers and over 50 photographs good reasons with contemporary arguments is distinctive in providing the most thorough coverage of rhetorical analysis and visual analysis it has a new emphasis on visual argument throughout that responds to the need for greater visual literacy in a media saturated culture good reasons with contemporary arguments is also distinctive in beginning with why people write arguments current issues such as privacy globalization science and ethics the media and the environment distinctive in its emphasis on visual rhetoric the text includes a thorough discussion of how good document design can support good reasons

the number and popularity of novels that have overtly reconfigured aspects of classic american texts suggests a

curious trend for both readers and writers an impulse to retell and reread books that have come to define american culture this book argues that by revising canonical american literature contemporary american writers are re writing an american myth of origins creating one that corresponds to the contemporary writer s understanding of self and society informed by cognitive psychology evolutionary literary criticism and poststructuralism entzminger reads texts by canonical authors poe hawthorne melville alcott twain chopin and faulkner and by the contemporary writers that respond to them in highlighting the construction and cognitive function of narrative in their own and in their antecedent texts contemporary writers highlight the fact that such use of narrative is universal and essential to human beings this book suggests that by revising the classic texts that compose our cultural narrative contemporary writers mirror the way human individuals consistently revisit and refigure the past through language via self narration in order to manage and understand experience

after taste is an inquiry into a field of study dedicated to the reconsideration reconstruction and rehabilitation of the concept of taste taste is the category whose systematic historical and actual dimensions have traditionally been located in a variety of disciplines the actuality and potential of the study is based on a variety of collected facts from readings and experiences which materialize in the following features one concept figurative taste two thinking traditions analytic and synthetic continental and three interrelated dimensions systematic historic and actual are presented in three volumes as such the study presents a salient comprehensive companion for wider readership of humanities approaching conceptions of taste for the first time moreover after taste is intended for anyone who hopes to make a further contribution to the subject since its appearance and apparently short triumph some 250 years ago the concept of non literary taste remained the linchpin of aesthetic theory and practice but also a category outreaching aesthetics taste as the personal unity of the production theory and criticism of art and literature which

was still largely taken as a given in the eighteenth century has meanwhile given way to a highly differentiated art world in which aesthetic discourse is placed in such a way that it can seemingly no longer have a conceptual or linguistic effect on general opinion making the critical role of taste judges ratings and rankings in the feuilleton politics and social media on the one hand and the responding search for new canons on the other have had a huge impact on the academic and popular discourse today however taste s impact on society is in fact all encompassing and yet without getting even close to the magnetic north of the academic compass after taste fills the gaps of systematic research by a comprehensive tracing of the emergence of the doctrines discourses and disciplinary dimensions of taste up to the peak of its systematic and historical trajectory in the eighteenth century and onwards into the present day the guiding goal is a post disciplinary rehabilitation of the contested category as a preparation for its productive usage in emerging academic and popular contexts three intertwined research hypotheses form the guiding goal of an overall study of the agencies of taste its institutionalizations and expert cultures the 1 first part provides a missing systematic perspective on the concept of taste as a key factor for understanding the human faculties value theories and practices of valuating the 2 second part traces the events at the peak of taste s systematic and historical trajectories up until the late eighteenth century and verifies the historiographical hypothesis about the instrumentality of taste for the production reception and distribution of culture the 3 third part reconstructs the major moments in which the contested concept of taste experiences its post disciplinary rehabilitation in preparation for its future productive usage in the academic and popular discourses and practices it shows how the category of taste became the foundation legitimation and the catalyst for the emerging division of labour faculties and disciplines confirming the hypothesis of the immense impact and actuality of taste in the contemporary world

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
