unusual manner by means of the power of imagination wordsworth defined poetry as the spontaneous overflow of powerful feelings and this consists on a breaking up with the 18th century concept of classicist canon which looked for poetical perfection on the contrary wordsworth is influenced by the new 19th century ideas of individualism and seeks for the use of imagination and true feelings not being so worried about poetical structural conventions

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
