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payments are a key focus of central banks as together with the safe efficient operation of the payments market wide access to cash is fundamentally important for a healthy economy in this study three main research areas were investigated 1 socioeconomic characteristics that can be associated with financial inclusion 2 factors behind consumers payment choices 3 underlying factors for holding cash in a wallet i e for transactional purposes regression results for the first research question confirmed the findings of international literature i e mainly older age lower income and lower educational level is associated with the lack of access to electronic payment options the study pursues various approaches to investigate consumer payments choices and the results from most models showed that those with higher level of income and education or lower level of cash income are more likely to prefer and actually use electronic payment methods finally concerning the holding of cash the initial expectations were confirmed i e those who do not use cash for daily transactions tend to keep less cash in their wallet while those who indicated preference for cash payments or higher importance of cash payment option are more likely to keep higher cash amounts

the two sided market theory holds that consumer adoption and merchant acceptance of payment cards are interdependent however empirical evidence on such network externalities is scarce especially for the merchant side this paper uses a logit model to explain merchant card acceptance in france we exploit shopping diary data to construct a novel and fine grained measure of french consumers payment preferences and match these with data from a nation wide merchant survey controlling for among other factors cost degree of competition and customer characteristics we find that the higher the probability that the average basket of a merchant is paid for by card in shops in the same sector and region the higher the probability that the merchant will accept cards in other words we find that consumer preferences drive merchant card acceptance which underpins the existence of network externalities on the merchant side of the payment card market

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we use new data from the 2015 diary of consumer payment choice to analyze price discounts and surcharges based on the payment method used for transactions we examine consumer preferences for specific payment instruments and test whether consumer demand for payment instruments is price elastic specifically we test

whether consumers are likely to deviate from their preferred methods in order to get a discount or to avoid a surcharge we find that the occurrence of price incentives is low but consumers who preferred other payment methods had an 11 7 percent probability of switching to cash because of cash discounts after controlling for merchant category and dollar value of the transaction payment method choice is affected very strongly by consumer individual preferences but steering by merchants may be effective under some circumstances both merchants reluctance to offer price discounts and consumers limited response to them lead to the low observed occurrences of such incentives

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
