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gender and sexuality diversity in a culture of limitation provides an outstanding and insightful critique of the ways that contemporary education is impacted by a range of political social and cultural influences that inform the approaches that schools take in relation to gender and sexuality diversity by applying feminist poststructural and foucauldian frameworks the book examines the ongoing impact of broader socio cultural discourse on the lives of gender and sexuality diverse students and teachers beginning with an overview of the impact of how a culture of limitation is realised in australia the focus moves beyond this context to examine state and federal policies from comparable societies in countries including the usa and the uk and their effect on the production of knowledges and what s permissible to include in educational curriculum this research driven book thus provides a comparative international overview of the current state of gender and sexuality diversity in schools and convincingly demonstrates that despite some empowerment of gender and sexuality diverse individuals silencing and marginalization remain powerful forces this book will be of great interest to graduate and postgraduate students academics professionals and policy makers interested in the field of gender and sexuality in education it is essential reading for those involved in pre service and in service teacher education diversity education the sociology of education as well as education more generally

this book in its first part contains units of conceptual history of several topics of physics based on the research in physics education and research based articles with regard to several topics involved in teaching science in general and physics in particular the second part of the book includes the framework used the approach considering science knowledge as a special type of culture discipline culture within this approach scientific knowledge is considered as comprised of a few inclusive fundamental theories each hierarchically structured in a triadic pattern nucleus body periphery while nucleus incorporates the basic principles and body comprises their implementations in the variety of laws models and experiments periphery includes concepts at odds to the nucleus this structure introduces knowledge in its conceptual variation thus converting disciplinary knowledge to cultural disciplinary one the approach draws on history and philosophy of science hps necessary for meaningful learning of science it is exemplified in several aspects regarding teaching physics presenting history in classes considering the special nature of science and using artistic images in regular teaching the revealed conceptual debate around the chosen topics clarifies the subject matter for school students and teachers encouraging construction of cultural content knowledge often missed in teachers preparation and common curriculum it helps genuine understanding of science thus providing remedy of students misconceptions reported in educational research

this volume is a path breaking contribution to the study of efforts of diaspora indigenous and minority groups broadly defined to use education formal and informal to sustain cultural continuity while grappling with the influences and demands of wider globalizing nationalizing or other homogenizing and assimilatory forces particular attention is given to groups that use educational elements other than second language teaching alone in programs to sustain their particular cultural traditions the focus of the book on cultural

sustainability changes the nature of questions posed in multicultural education from those that address the opening of boundaries to issues of preserving boundaries in an open yet sustainable way as forced and elective immigration trends are changing the composition of societies and the educational systems within them bringing a rich diversity of cultural experience to the teaching learning process diaspora indigenous and minority groups are looking more and more for ways to sustain their cultures in the context of wider socio political influences this volume is a first opportunity to consider critically multicultural efforts in dialogue with educational options that are culturally particularistic but at the same time tolerant academics will find this an excellent reference book practitioners will draw inspiration in learning of others efforts to sustain cultures and will engage in critical reflection on their own work vis à vis that of others teachers will realize they do not stand alone in their educational efforts and will uncover new strategies and methodologies through which to approach their work
