many of today's learning environments are dominated by technology or procedure driven approaches that leave learners feeling alone and disconnected the authors of centring human connections in the education of health professionals argue that educational processes in the health disciplines should model integrate and celebrate human connections because it is these connections that will foster the development of competent and caring health professionals centring human connections in the education of health professionals equips educators working in clinical classroom and online settings with a variety of teaching strategies that facilitate essential human connections included is an overview of the educational theory that grounds the authors thinking enabling the educators who employ the strategies included in the book to assess their fit within curriculum requirements and personal teaching philosophies and understand how and why they work

this volume is an attempt to synthesize the understandings we have about reading to learn although learning at all ages is discussed in this volume the main focus is on middle and high school classrooms critical spaces of learning and thinking the amount of knowledge presented in written form is increasing and the information we get from texts is often conflicting we are in a knowledge explosion that leaves us reeling and may effectively disenfranchise those who are not keeping up there has never been a more crucial time for students to understand learn from and think critically about the information in various forms of text thus understanding what it means to learn is vital for all educators learning from text is a complex matter that includes student factors social ethnic and cultural differences as well as varying motivations self perceptions goals and needs instructional and teacher factors and disciplinary and social factors one important goal of the book is to encourage practicing teachers to learn to consider their students in new ways to see them as being influenced by and as influencing not just the classroom but the total fabric of the disciplines they are learning equally important it is intended to foster further research efforts from local studies of classrooms by teachers to large scale studies that produce generalizable understandings about learning from text this volume a result of the editor's and contributors work with the national reading research center will be of interest to all researchers graduate students practicing teachers and teachers in training who are interested in understanding the issues that are central to improving students learning from text

understanding the complexity of the natural world and making sense of phenomena is one of the main goals of science and science education when investigating complex phenomena such as climate change or pandemic outbreaks students are expected to engage in systems thinking by considering

the boundaries of the investigated system identifying the relevant components and their interactions and exploring system attributes such as hierarchical organization dynamicity feedback loops and emergence scientific models are tools that support students reasoning and understanding of complex systems and students are expected to develop their modeling competence and to engage in the modeling process by constructing testing revising and using models to explain and predict phenomena computational modeling tools for example provide students with the opportunity to explore big data run simulations and investigate complex systems therefore both systems thinking and modeling approaches are important for science education when investigating complex phenomena
