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learn about the best science fiction authors and books in historythis book is a great summary of the best sci fi and fantasy books and series from history it is worth reading because of this whether you are new to science fiction or have been reading this genre for years i hope you will have as much fun reading this book as i had writing it in this history i ve tried to include the best known authors and their most famous and interesting works many of these stories are groundbreaking some launched new sub genres and some talked about technology which is now real or being developed i have read almost all of the novels mentioned here i ve also summarized various great novels throughout this book these are stories you will enjoy reading they might be examples of the changing genres or just really good yarns there are a lot of stories i love in the sci fi and fantasy realm and i hope you like them too i ve literally read thousands of science fiction and fantasy books over the years starting in the 1960s up until today some of the stories i ve read have made significant marks on my life my degree in engineering is also probably a result of my interests in science and technology from growing up reading the wonder the vastness of these stories here are many of the best books i ve read and enjoyed questions and answers what information is included about each book there is a one to two page summary on each one so you can get an idea of the story to see if you want to read it is there really much history to these genres yes science fiction and fantasy stories go way back into history you will learn how the genres of sci fi and fantasy really developed get this book today and you will love it you will also learn about many good books to read you may not have even known about
