the life and death of julius caesar or the tragedy of julius caesar first folio title the tragedie of ivlivi ceasar is a history play and tragedy by william shakespeare first performed in 1599 it is one of several plays written by shakespeare based on true events from roman history such as coriolanus and antony and cleopatra set in rome in 44 bc the play depicts the moral dilemma of brutus as he joins a conspiracy led by cassius to murder julius caesar to prevent him from becoming dictator of rome following caesar s death rome is thrust into a period of civil war and the republic the conspirators sought to preserve is lost forever although the play is named julius caesar brutus speaks more than four times as many lines as the title character and the central psychological drama of the play focuses on brutus struggle between the conflicting demands of honour patriotism and friendship the play opens with two tribunes discovering the commoners of rome celebrating julius caesar s triumphant return from defeating the sons of his military rival pompey the tribunes insulting the crowd for their change in loyalty from pompey to caesar attempt to end the festivities and break up the commoners who return the insults during the feast of lupercal caesar holds a victory parade and a soothsayer warns him to beware the ides of march which he ignores meanwhile cassius attempts to convince brutus to join his conspiracy to kill caesar although brutus friendly towards caesar is hesitant to kill him he agrees that caesar may be abusing his power they then hear from casca that mark antony has offered caesar the crown of rome three times and that each time caesar refused it with increasing reluctance in hopes that the crowd watching the exchange would beg him to accept the crown yet the crowd applauded caesar for denying the crown upsetting caesar due to his wanting to accept the crown on the eve of the ides

of march the conspirators meet and reveal that they have forged letters of support from the roman people to tempt brutus into joining brutus reads the letters and after much moral debate decides to join the conspiracy thinking that caesar should be killed to prevent him from doing anything against the people of rome if he were ever to be crowned after ignoring the soothsayer as well as his wife calpurnia's own premonitions caesar goes to the senate the conspirators approach him with a fake petition pleading on behalf of metellus cimber's banished brother as caesar predictably rejects the petition casca and the others suddenly stab him brutus is last at this point caesar utters the famous line *et tu brute* 2 and you brutus i.e. you too brutus concluding with then fall caesar the conspirators make clear that they committed this murder for the good of rome not for their own purposes and do not attempt to flee the scene brutus delivers an oration defending his own actions and for the moment the crowd is on his side however mark antony makes a subtle and eloquent speech over caesar's corpse beginning with the much quoted *friends romans countrymen lend me your ears* 3 in this way he deftly turns public opinion against the assassins by manipulating the emotions of the common people in contrast to the rational tone of brutus's speech yet there is method in his rhetorical speech and gestures he reminds them of the good caesar had done for rome his sympathy with the poor and his refusal of the crown at the lupercal thus questioning brutus's claim of caesar's ambition he shows caesar's bloody lifeless body to the crowd to have them shed tears and gain sympathy for their fallen hero and he reads caesar's will in which every roman citizen would receive 75 drachmas antony even as he states his intentions against it rouses the mob to drive the conspirators from rome
