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intended for the absolute beginner introducing phonetics and phonology requires no previous background in linguistics phonetics or phonology starting with a grounding in phonetics and phonological theory this book provides a base from which more advanced treatments may be approached it begins with an examination of the foundations of articulatory and acoustic phonetics moves on to the basic principles of phonology and ends with an outline of some further issues within contemporary phonology varieties of english particularly received pronunciation and general american are often used for exemplification but aspects of the phonetics and phonology of other languages are discussed as well this new edition includes revised exercises and examples a new chapter on the distinction between phonetics and phonology and a discussion of differing but complementary roles of phonetics and phonology and material on current approaches to phonology including optimality theory radical cv phonology and government phonology introducing phonetics and phonology fifth edition remains the essential introduction for any students studying this topic for the first time

this book investigates variation in the classroom speech of 7 year old children who are learning standard jamaican english as a second language variety in rural jamaica for sociolinguists and second language dialect researchers interested in the acquisition and use of sociolinguistic variables an important challenge is how to efficiently account for language learning mechanisms and use to date this book is the first to offer an interdisciplinary look into phonological and phonetic variation observed in primary school in jamaica that is from the perspective of classic variationist and quantitative sociolinguistics and a usage based model both frameworks function as explanatory for the children s learning of phono stylistic variation which they encounter in their immediate linguistic environment i e most often through their teachers speech this book is intended for sociolinguists interested in child language variation linguists working on formal aspects of the languages of the caribbean applied linguists concerned with the teaching and learning of second language phonology and any researchers interested in applying variationist and quantitative methods to classroom second language learning

dogon cosmology provides a new rosetta stone for reinterpreting egyptian hieroglyphs provides a new understanding of egyptian hieroglyphs as scientific symbols based on dogon cosmological drawings use parallels between dogon and egyptian word meanings to identify relationships between dogon myths and modern science in the science of the dogon laird scranton demonstrated that the cosmological structure described in the myths and drawings of the dogon runs parallel to modern science atomic theory quantum theory and string theory their drawings often taking the same form as accurate scientific diagrams that relate to the formation of matter scranton also pointed to the close resemblance between the keywords and component elements of dogon cosmology and those of ancient egypt and the implication that ancient cosmology may also be about actual science sacred symbols of the dogon uses these parallels as the starting point for a new interpretation of the egyptian hieroglyphic language by substituting dogon cosmological drawings for equivalent glyph shapes in egyptian words a new way of reading and interpreting the egyptian hieroglyphs emerges scranton shows how each hieroglyph constitutes an entire concept and that their meanings are scientific in nature using the dogon symbols as a rosetta stone he reveals references within the ancient egyptian language that define the full range of scientific components of matter from massless waves to the completed atom even suggesting direct correlations to a fully realized unified field theory

over the last decades it has been hotly debated whether and how compounds i e word formations and phrases differ from each other the book discusses this issue by investigating compounds and phrases from a structural semantic functional and crucially cognitive perspective the analysis focuses on compounds and phrases that are composed of either an adjective and a noun or two nouns in german french and english having distinguished compounds from phrases on structural and semantic functional grounds the author claims that compounds are by their nature more appropriate to be stored in the mental lexicon than phrases and supports his argument with empirical evidence from new psycholinguistic studies in sum the book maintains the separation between compounds and phrases and reflects upon its cognitive consequences

this book constitutes the refereed proceedings of the 8th international conference on text speech and dialogue tsd 2005 held in karlovy vary czech republic in september 2005 the 52 revised full papers presented together with 6 invited papers were carefully reviewed and selected from 134 submissions the papers present a wealth of state of the art research results in the field of natural language processing with an emphasis on text speech and

spoken dialogue ranging from theoretical and methodological issues to applications in various fields such as information retrieval the semantic algorithmic learning classification and clustering speaker recognition and verification and dialogue management

this book provides a detailed analysis of two major aspects glottalization and nasalization of the phonology and phonetics of coatzospan mixtec as well as an overview of the segmental phonology of the language from a descriptive perspective this work provides the first published phonetic data on coatzospan mixtec one of the many underdescribed indigenous languages of the americas of theoretical importance the phonological analyses of glottalization and nasalization serve as examples of how optimality theory can be implemented in the extended treatment of a single language in contrast to the typological emphasis of most optimality research by focusing in detail on the whole of nasalization and glottalization systems the book explores the implications of optimality theory for the traditional notion of underlying representation in phonological theory and motivates an extension of the mechanism of constraint conjunction to include conditional relations holding between distinct constraints in the grammar at the same time the phonetic analyses provide an example of a detailed treatment of the phonetic implementation of nasalization and glottalization in the windows framework of special interest here is the relation between phonetic data and phonological feature specification in particular the data illustrate the complexity of the relationship between patterns of phonetic implementation and feature specification and lead to the conclusion that phonetic data must be interpreted in the context of the phonological system from which they are derived this book is of interest to linguists in general and especially to researchers in both phonology and phonetics to those interested in field work on underdescribed languages and to those interested in native american languages and linguistics
