research methods in applied behavior analysis 2nd edition is a practical text that provides the beginning researcher with a clear description of how behavior analysts conduct applied research and submit it for publication in a sequence of ten logical steps the text covers the elements of single case research design and the practices involved in organizing implementing and evaluating research studies this revision includes new material on how to critique a journal article and how to extract treatment ideas from published studies the novice researcher receives a steps for success approach that is brief useful to the point and clearly delineated

dissemination is a key component of the research process while several fields have developed resources dedicated to training and supporting their scientists and practitioners as they are encouraged to disseminate within their fields and to the larger public audience there has been a lack of formal guidance for dissemination within the behavioral sciences disseminating behavioral science aims to fill that gap providing guidance across modalities for topics ranging from the peer review process to conference presentation to

nontraditional avenues for dissemination the contents of this edited text divided across six sections serves as a roadmap for students junior researchers and senior scholars the first section includes types of academic scholarship types of dissemination and strategies to ensure ethical dissemination the second reviews traditional publication preparation including tips for the writing process and key components to include in each section of a scientific manuscript section three explores publication within a traditional peer reviewed journal section four outlines additional strategies to get research publicly recognized through conference presentations social media and popular media sources and white and grey literature sections five and six offer a consolidated glossary of all key terms in the text and combined reference list

applied behavior analysis aba is a highly functional discipline that instead of searching for abstract internal causes for human behavior looks to external factors that can be influenced once identified these factors can be manipulated to make meaningful positive improvements in the lives of real people through positive behavior change not surprisingly behavior analysis has been applied to a wide range of human activities from helping troubled teens to organizing industry to maximizing sports performance aba interventions for these diverse problems are often creative and they tend to be effective in this volume some of the field's foremost practitioners offer their expert perspective on a range of topics within aba each chapter is fully referenced and contains a set of reading objectives to facilitate deeper understanding and further discussion of its subject area while these discussions will be of particular interest to academic behavior analysts and graduate students clinicians and other practitioners will find the research review helpful and informative

the rapid growth of behavior therapy over the past 20 years has been well documented yet the geometric expansion of the field has been so great that it deserves to be recounted we all received our graduate training in the mid to late 1960s courses in behavior therapy were then a rarity behavioral training was based more on informal tutorials than on systematic programs of study the behavioral literature was so circumscribed that it could be easily mastered in a few months of study a mere half dozen books by wolpe lazarus eysenck ullmann and krasner more or less comprised the behavioral library in the mid 1960s seminal works by ayllon and azrin bandura franks and kanfer in 1968 and 1969 made it only slightly more difficult to survey the field keeping abreast of new developments was not very difficult as behaviour research and therapy and the journal of applied behavior analysis were the only regular outlets for behavioral articles until the end of the decade when behavior therapy and behavior therapy and experimental psychiatry first appeared we are too young to be maudlin but oh for the good old days one of us did a quick survey of his bookshelves and stopped counting books with behavior or behavioral in the titles when he reached 100 there were at least half again as many behavioral books without those words in the title

abstract a detailed examination of research on the clinical use of behavioral strategies for treatment of specific behavior disorders in adults and children e g alcoholism eating disorders physiological disorders neuroses depression sexual disorders is provided for college students and professionals specific disorders and behavior modification approaches are dovered for children and youths suffering from psychosis mental retardation juvenile delinquency and school and family problems some traditional psychiatric disorders e g suicide manic depressive psychosis are excluded due to lack of sufficient research on behavioral treatment operant conditioning is applied to the treatment and prevention of behavior disorders wz

the branch of clinical psychology known as behavior modification or synonymously applied behavior analysis has grown substantially from humble beginnings in the 1960s many colleges and universities now offer courses in applied behavior analysis and more than a few grant degrees in the area although they remain controversial behavior mod ification procedures have been used to good advantage in dealing with a range of problem behaviors and are now rather widely employed in schools residential institutions and other therapeutic facilities the two hallmarks of applied behavior analysis are utilization of the principles of operant conditioning to improve human behavior and utilization of scientific research methodology to assess the effectiveness of treatments the present text provides an overview of several issues peculiar to applied behavior analysis research methodology six general areas of concern are a trends in applied behavior analysis research b assessment and measurement issues c experimental designs and strategies d interpretation of findings e ethical issues in applied behavior analysis and f the societal impact of studies in the area as evidenced by a sizable number of recently published articles these topics are of considerable interest to behavior analysts they also are relevant for students of scientific epistemology and general psychological research methods
