adrian forty professor of architectural history at the bartlett school of architecture university college london ucl who has been internationally renowned as the uk's leading academic in the discipline for 40 years forty's many publications notably *objects of desire* 1986 *words and buildings* 2000 and *concrete and culture* 2012 have been crucial to opening up new approaches to architectural history and theory and have helped to establish entirely new areas of study his teaching at the bartlett has enthused a new generation about the exciting possibilities of architectural history and theory as a field this collection takes in a total of 40 essays covering key subjects ranging from memory and heritage to everyday life building materials and city spaces as well as critical theory philosophy literature and experimental design it refers to more immediate and topical issues in the built environment such as globalisation localism regeneration and ecologies concise and engaging entries reflect on architecture from a range of perspectives contributors include eminent historians and theorists from elsewhere such as jean louis cohen briony fer hildeheynen mary mcleod griselda pollock penny sparke and anthony vidler as well as forty's colleagues from the bartlett school of architecture including iain borden murray fraser peter hall barbara penner jane rendell and andrew saint forty ways to think about architecture also features contributions from distinguished architects such as tony fetton jeremy till and sarah wigglesworth and well known critics and architectural writers such as tom dyckhoff william menking and thomas weaver many of the contributors are former students of adrian forty through these diverse essays readers are encouraged to think about how architectural history and theory relates to their own research and design practices thus using the work of adrian forty as a catalyst for fresh and innovative thinking about architecture as a subject

in this book prominent architectural historians who happen to be women reflect on their practice and the intervention this has made in the discipline of particular concern are the ways in which feminine subjectivities have been embodied in the discourses of architectural history each of the chapters examines the author's own position and the disruptive presence of women as both subject and object in the historiography of a specific field of enquiry the aim is not to replace male lives with female lives or to write women into the masculinist narratives of architectural history instead this book aims to broaden the discourses of architectural history to explore how the potentially unnatural rule of women subverts canonical norms through the empowerment of otherness rather than a process of perceived emasculation the essays examine the historiographic and socio cultural implications of the role of women in the narratives and writing of architectural history with particular reference to western traditions of scholarship on the period 1600 1950 rather than subscribing to a single position individual voices critically engage with past and present canonical histories disclosing assumptions biases and absences in the architectural historiography of the west this book is a crucial reflection upon historiographical practice exploring potential openings that may contribute further transformation of the theory and methods of architectural history chapter 9 of this book is freely available as a downloadable open access pdf at taylorfrancis.com under a creative commons attribution noncommercial no derivatives cc by nc nd 4.0

the compiled essays offer various themes and ways of approaching historiography each chapter probes the state of contemporary theorization of architecture histories working toward the theme of critically re writing history essential to each author s contribution are specific traditions created by the mole of history burrowing through the past this book concerns the historian s conjectures towards capturing the past and present zeitgeist temporality is the theme running through the narrative of this volume it raises the question of whether the ever growing body of work on architectural history should be considered as history more specifically what is the intersection between history and architectural history furthermore can every text focused on architecture s past be considered categorically historiographic in what capacity does architectural history index history beyond contingencies and without reducing the text to empirical realities and the historian s interest in a specific subject including those collected through archival research itself an emblem of textuality this book upholds the conviction that the past should be recalled accurately and that there is no history but historical criticism the scope of which exceeds the historicity of humanism dialectically the timeline experienced across contemporary techno economic and cultural domains aesthetics offers an opportunity to explore architecture produced outside the euro american continents valences of historiography offers a fresh take on architectural history that is useful for academics researchers and architecture students

excerpt from a text book of the history of architecture the aim of this work has been to sketch the various periods and styles of architecture with the broadest possible strokes and to mention with such brief characterization as seemed permissible or necessary the most important works of each period or style extreme condensation in presenting the leading facts of architectural history has been necessary and much that would rightly claim place in a larger work has been omitted here the danger was felt to be rather in the direction of too much detail than of too little while the book is intended primarily to meet the special requirements of the college student those of the general reader have not been lost sight of the majority of the technical terms used are defined or explained in the context and the small remainder in a glossary at the end of the work extended criticism and minute description were out of the question and discussion of controverted
