to present multiple perspectives on events and contentious issues for instance the politicized issue of women s state mandated modest dress huang also explains how the turkic speaking qashqa i relate to the wider iranian society and the islamic republic of iran adapting to a rapidly changing world while retaining tribal values and a distinctive ethnolinguistic identity as one of iran s national minorities in describing life at the local level in iran huang depicts a community largely beyond the scope and reach of foreign travellers and the western media with rich ethnographic description and analysis intimate portraits of the private lives and spaces of women and children and diverse perspectives this engagingly written account documents a disappearing way of life tribeswomen of iran is essential reading for all those interested in iran the middle east anthropology nomadism and gender
