north america about 450 persons participated in the program either as speakers or as presiders approximately 40 percent of these came from the u s or canada there were four plenary addresses they were delivered by hans freudenthal on major problems of mathematics education hermina sinclair on the relationship between the learning of language and of mathematics seymour papert on the computer as carrier of mathematical culture and hua loo keng on popularising and applying mathematical methods gearge polya was the honorary president of the congress illness prevented his planned attendence but he sent a brief presentation entitled mathematics improves the mind there was a full program of speakers panelists debates miniconferences and meetings of working and study groups in addition 18 major projects from around the world were invited to make presentations and various groups representing special areas of concern had the opportunity to meet and to plan their future activities
