explaining and predicting behavior if a student develops criteria by which to judge a theory that critical framework can be applied to assess the strengths and weaknesses of any new theory confidence in evaluating contributions helps students appreciate and participate in the process the connections between theorizing and practical applications stimulate interest and further exploration the text does not attempt to be encyclopedic rather it offers a synthesized coherent view of theory from the social scientific perspective emphasizing contributions from communication theorists learning about theory should be an enjoyable experience building communication theory creates a context for involving students in an exciting and valuable pursuit
