the message in creating readers with poetry is simple and strong poetry helps children learn to read in this innovative resource nile stanley offers you teaching techniques that transform reading from a two dimensional world of boredom and frustration into a three dimensional world of voice movement and artistic expression he shows you how poetry supports the teaching of reading and allows students to relax and blossom his mini lessons and engaging activity poems provide standards based reading instruction that also build community confidence and enthusiasm he includes a cd of sung and spoken poetry performed by noted children s poets and students to use as instructional models

spanning four centuries from the renaissance to today s avant garde migration and mutation explores how the sonnet has evolved in and out of translation contributors examine little studied translation trajectories in the early modern period such as the pivotal role of france between italy and england or the first german sonnets and their italian french dutch and scottish origins essays then shed new light on major european sonneteers in the 19th and 20th centuries including shakespeare keats yeats rilke and pessoa alongside lesser known contemporaries and with novel approaches and finally contributors explore how translation and adaptation create metaphorical space in the 21st century migration and mutation also pays attention to the political or subversive dimension of the sonnet with essays on women gay or postcolonial reclaimings of the sonnet and recent experiments such as post soviet sonnets on shirts by genrikh sagpir it takes the sonnet out of the confines of enclosed national traditions bringing it into renewed contact with mostly european but also other cultures

the encyclopedia of american poetry the twentieth century contains over 400 entries that treat a broad range of individual poets and poems along with many articles devoted to topics schools or periods of american verse in the century entries fall into three main categories poet entries which provide biographical and cultural contexts for the author s career entries on individual works which offer closer explication of the most resonant poems in the 20th century canon and topical entries which offer analyses of a given period of literary production school thematically constructed category or other verse tradition that historically has been in dialogue with the poetry of the united states

in this capacious and energetic volume ira sadoff argues that poets live and write within

history our artistic values always reflecting attitudes about both literary history and culture at large history matters does not return to the culture war that reduced complex arguments about human nature creativity identity and interplay between individual and collective identity to slogans rather sadoff peels back layers of clutter to reveal the important questions at the heart of any complex and fruitful discussion about the connections between culture and literature much of our most adventurous writing has occurred at history s margins simultaneously making use of and resisting tradition by tracking key contemporary poets including john ashbery olena kaltyiak davis louise glück czeslaw milosz frank o hara and c k williams as well as musing on jazz and other creative enterprises sadoff investigates the lively poetic art of those who have grappled with late twentieth century attitudes about history subjectivity contingency flux and modernity in plainspoken writing he probes the question of the poet s capacity to illuminate and universalize truth along the way we are called to consider how and why art moves and transforms human beings

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
