macbeth full title the tragedy of macbeth is a tragedy by william shakespeare it is thought to have been first performed in 1606 it dramatises the damaging physical and psychological effects of political ambition on those who seek power for its own sake of all the plays that shakespeare wrote during the reign of james i who was patron of shakespeare s acting company macbeth most clearly reflects the playwright s relationship with his sovereign it was first published in the folio of 1623 possibly from a prompt book and is shakespeare s shortest tragedy a brave scottish general named macbeth receives a prophecy from a trio of witches that one day he will become king of scotland consumed by ambition and spurred to action by his wife macbeth murders king duncan and takes the scottish throne for himself he is then wracked with guilt and paranoia forced to commit more and more murders to protect himself from enmity and suspicion he soon becomes a tyrannical ruler the bloodbath and consequent civil war swiftly take macbeth and lady macbeth into the realms of madness and death shakespeare s source for the story is the account of macbeth king of scotland macduff and duncan in holinshed s chronicles 1587 a history of england scotland and ireland familiar to shakespeare and his contemporaries although the events in the play differ extensively from the history of the real macbeth the events of the tragedy are usually associated with the execution of henry garnet for complicity in the gunpowder plot of 1605 in the backstage world of theatre some believe that the play is cursed and will not mention its title aloud referring to it instead as the scottish play over the course of many centuries the play has attracted some of the most renowned actors to the roles of macbeth and lady macbeth it has been adapted to film television opera novels comics and other media a midsummer night s dream is a comedy written by william shakespeare c 1595 or 1596 the play is set in athens and consists of several subplots that revolve around the marriage of theseus and hippolyta one subplot involves a conflict between four athenian lovers another follows a group of six amateur actors rehearsing the play which they are to perform before the wedding both groups find themselves in a forest inhabited by fairies who manipulate the humans and are engaged in their own domestic intrigue the play is one of shakespeare s most popular and is widely performed
