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for the first time in four decades there exists an authoritative and up to date survey of the literature of the united states from prehistoric cave narratives to the radical movements of the sixties and the experimentation of the eighties this comprehensive volume one of the century s most important books in american studies extensively treats hawthorne melville dickinson hemingway and other long cherished writers while also giving considerable attention to recently discovered writers such as kate chopin and to literary movements and forms of writing not studied amply in the past informed by the most current critical and theoretical ideas it sets forth a generation s interpretation of the rise of american civilization and culture the columbia literary history of the united states contains essays by today s foremost scholars and critics overseen by a board of distinguished editors headed by emory elliott of princeton university these contributors reexamine in contemporary terms traditional subjects such as the importance of puritanism romanticism and frontier humor in american life and writing but they also fully explore themes and materials that have only begun to receive

deserved attention in the last two decades among these are the role of women as writers readers and literary subjects and the impact of writers from minority groups both inside and outside the literary establishment

designed as a companion to the columbia literary history of the united states this compilation of 31 major essays covers the american novel from the 1700s to the present although the majority deal with the 20th century within each era themes genres and topics such as realism gender romance and technology are discussed in depth as well as modern canadian caribbean and latin american fiction each essayist selects only the authors who best illustrate the topic thus subtly skewing the view of the literary scene at that time the volume also covers women minorities popular fiction and the book marketplace isbn 0 231 07360 7 59 95

in our globalised world literature is less and less confined to national spaces europe centred frameworks for literary studies have become insufficient academics are increasingly called upon to address matters of cultural difference in this unique volume leading scholars discuss the critical and methodical challenges that these developments pose to the writing of literary history what is the object of literary history what is the meaning of the term world literature how do we compare different cultural systems of genres how do we account theoretically for literary transculturation what are the implications of postcolonial studies for the discipline of comparative literature ranging in focus from the persian epic of majnun layla and zulu praise poetry to south korean novels and brazilian antropofagismo the essays offer a concise overview of these and related questions their aim is not to reach a consensus on these matters they show instead what is at stake in the emergent field of global comparatism

the columbia history of chinese literature is a comprehensive yet portable guide to china s vast literary traditions stretching from earliest times to the present the text features original contributions by leading specialists working in all genres and periods chapters cover poetry prose fiction and drama and consider such contextual subjects as popular culture the impact of religion the role of women and china s relationship with non sinitic languages and peoples opening with a major section on the linguistic and intellectual foundations of chinese literature the anthology traces the development of forms and movements over time along with critical trends and pays particular attention to the premodern canon

with over forty original essays the oxford handbook of modern chinese literatures offers an in depth engagement with the current analytical methodologies and critical practices that are shaping the field in the twenty first century divided into three sections structure taxonomy and methodology the volume carefully moves across approaches genres and forms to address a rich range topics that include popular culture in late qing china zhang guangyu s journey to the west in cartoons writings of southeast asian migrants in taiwan the chinese anglophone novel and depictions of hiv aids in chu t ien wen s notes of a desolate man

the latest early american literature according to readers for the university of

delaware press is a collection of polemics and manifestoes in it r c de prosopo bids to follow in the footsteps of the two rare early americanist dissenters whom philip f gura once distinguished as prophets without honor in the field william spengemann and michael colacurcio the book contends that a supposedly retired nationalist modernist telos continues to reign in most of the latest scholarship and even more influentially in all of the current literary histories and anthologies no matter how expansive in gender ethnic racial and hemispheric inclusiveness they profess to be old teloi in particular that old american exceptionalist one can be cunning updating and expanding upon essays written over the past thirty years de prosopo proposes not only negatively to critique how the latest scholarly receptions of early american literature differ insignificantly from the earlier ones but positively to propose how a transnationalist concession that as a neocolonial culture america s lags behind that of europe might advance post modern historiography by radically repositioning the past as no longer the present s diachronic predecessor but to quote lyotard s semiotics its synchronic differend closer to earth de prosopo tries at the same time to remain mindful of the pedagogical imperative that ultimately to save the texts of early american literature will require making them legible to average non specialist never to become specialist undergraduate general education students to facilitate this he introduces in the concluding section of the latest early american literature what will probably be taken as its most radical intervention the redefinition of edgar allan poe as an early american writer

american literature before 1880 attempts to place its subject in the broadest possible international perspective it begins with homer looking westward and ends with henry james crossing the atlantic eastwards in between the book examines the projection of images of the east onto an as yet unrecognised west the cultural consequences of viking colombian and then english migration to america the growth and independence of the british american colonies the key writers of the new republic and the development of the culture of the united states before and after the civil war it is intended both as an introduction for undergraduates to the richness and variety of american literature and as a contribution to the debate about its distinctive nature the book therefore begins with a lengthy survey of earlier histories of american literature

this outstanding collection brings together essays that reflect on the nature of narrative literary criticism and history from a variety of theoretical and disciplinary perspectives ranging from deconstruction psychoanalysis and trauma theory to narratology technology economics and aesthetics acts of narrative includes responses from renowned scholars across a wide range of disciplines philosopher jacques derrida the literary critic j hillis miller w j t mitchell well known for his reflections on the visual world and cathy caruth one of the founders of the field of trauma theory these essays are brilliant in their readings of other texts but are also striking in the manner in which each becomes itself a narrative performance moreover what starts out as an exercise in theorizing and reading moves more often than not into a meditation on social and political issues crucial for our own sense of ourselves

slovenia and ukraine harold b segel a longtime scholar of slavic literatures and of comparative literature writes a clear concise and balanced history of eastern european literature segel not only examines the literary response to the quasi colonial oppression that stretched across eastern europe between 1945 and 1991 but also details the impact of the downfall of communism and the way in which the challenges of the postcommunist period are being met segel s history follows a unique chronological topical approach that begins with the treatment of world war ii in eastern european fiction and follows with such topics as the postwar imposition of soviet style literary controls primarily in the form of socialist realism literary responses to the brutal campaign of collectivization after 1945 the impact of the death of stalin and expectations of change exile and creativity strategies of literary evasion and subterfuge writing born from the experience of prison and labor camps and the rise of solidarity in poland he also handles varieties of postmodernism throughout the region poetry by women and the continued struggle for freedom of expression the resonance of the yugoslav wars of the 1990s on imaginative literature eastern european writers and their relationship to america and the major postcommunist trends of new urbanism nostalgia emigration and minority concerns
