1941 she left her university studies to join the red army ignoring offers of positions as a nurse she became part of soviet russia s elite group of female snipers within a year she had 309 confirmed kills including 29 enemy sniper kills renowned as the scourge of german soldiers she was regarded as a key heroic figure for the war effort and in 1942 on stalin s personal orders she travelled as part of a soviet delegation to the west fundraising in canada great britain and the usa dubbed lady death she spoke out about gender equality in the red army and made the case for the usa to continue the fight against the nazis in europe the folk singer woody guthric wrote a song about her exploits miss pavlichenko and she visited the white house where she formed an unlikely but long lasting friendship with cleanor roosevelt in november 1942 she visited coventry and accepted donations of 4 516 from coventry workers to pay for three x ray units for the red army she also visited a birmingham factory as part of her fundraising tour

the soviet union had developed a significant sniping force by 1939 but the extraordinary skill and cunning displayed by finnish snipers during the winter war forced the soviets to innovate on the other side german sniping suffered from a lack of standardization of weapons and a lack of marksmen deployed at the start of the great patriotic war 1941 45 there were few heroes in the conflict but on both sides the snipers were idolized especially on the soviet side gaining almost mythical status as well as traditional bolt action weapons both sides used several types of semi automatic rifle such as the svt 38 and the gew 41 offering greater firepower at the expense of long range accuracy such weapons would be profoundly influential in the postwar world fully illustrated this absorbing study investigates the development of sniping weapons and techniques on world war ii s eastern front

before and after the outbreak of the second world war there were a number of sizable fascist groups active in britain all of whom were working towards a violent uprising to overthrow the british government these groups included the right club led by captain jock ramsey mp arnold leese s imperial fascist league and sir oswald mosley s british union of fascists when churchill became prime minister in may 1940 ramsay leese mosley and hundreds of their supporters were arrested and interned they were released in 1943 and 1944 all the more embittered and just as intent on bringing about the installation of a fascist government in britain which ramsay hoped to lead churchill was the man they hated most under chamberlain they had remained free men churchill had interned them and sworn to fight the nazis to the bitter end britain under churchill would never surrender in the autumn of 1944 adolf hitler made his last attempt to achieve victory in the west or at least a favorable peace he would then be free to concentrate on defeating the soviet union in the ardennes he launched a massive counter attack using dirty tricks and murdering prisoners that has become known as the battle of the bulge in italy he counter attacked down the serchio valley and in the uk he gave orders for an uprising or escape in all of the german camps under nazi control and in at least one of the italian fascist prisoner of war camps a part of hitler s plan was the assassination simultaneously of both churchill and eisenhower this was the opportunity ramsay had been waiting for under the cover of a social for all those who had been released from detention a meeting was arranged for the day of the breakout they would join and aid the uprising providing invaluable support an organization called the prisoners of war assistance society set up by members of leese s organization was to help the prisoners get out two nazi camps were to lead the break out camps no 23 devizes and no 17 sheffield the plot was discovered by chance at camp 23 and foiled nazi vehmic court murders of suspected informers followed in relation to camp 23 and at camp 17 the plan was been to seize us military ambulances in devizes and tanks and armoured vehicles and to advance on london the ambulances would provide useful camouflage in the same manner as captured us vehicles and

uniforms were used in the battle of the bulge waiting and willing to help them at the house of commons in london was jock ramsay mp he continued to serve as an mp after his release from four years detention and when he attended the house he would sit within yards of his greatest enemy winston churchill in december 1944 churchill was in london and addressed the house of commons on 14 and 20 december ramsay had the right to attend the house of commons at all times and his right club had once boasted eleven mps amongst its members he could provide the german task force with assistance in their attempt to kill or capture churchill and other cabinet ministers thus leaving britain without its leaders at a vital moment a simultaneous plot to assassinate general eisenhower was discovered during the battle of the bulge it was known as eisenhower aktion and involved english speaking germans disguised as us soldiers and driving us vehicles this is the incredible disturbing story of how close british fascists came to impacting the outcome of the second world war it is also a comprehensive investigation into the break out plot as it unfolded across britain how it came to fruition and how it was quashed its repercussions and the many little known stories of escape and recapture which took place throughout the country

the period 1865 90 was one of unparalleled change in american frontier history this span of 25 years witnessed the end of the traditional nomadic lifestyle of the plains indians the colonisation of the west by white settlers and the first experience of the us army in fighting a form of irregular warfare for which its soldiers and commanders were untrained and its equipment unsuited that they acquitted themselves so well in the face of bureaucratic meddling poor supply and appalling climatic conditions speaks highly of the tenacity and physical toughness of the volunteers who served in the west during campaigns such as the comanche campaign 1867 1875 the red river war 1874 1875 the nez perce war 1877 and the ghost dance war 1890 1891 among others

while germany and austria hungary were well equipped with sniping rifles in 1914 their allied opponents were not this highly illustrated volume tells the inside story of the rifles carried by snipers of all the major powers during world war i although military sharpshooting had existed since the 18th century in 1914 only the german and austro hungarian armies fielded trained snipers armed with scoped rifles thus upon the outbreak of world war i the allied armies found themselves on the receiving end of a shooting war to which they had no means of response only the canadians brought a dedicated sniping rifle into the trenches but in small numbers for the british although production of a suitable rifle and scope were settled on quickly the establishment of sniper training was difficult and its success was mostly due to the efforts of a handful of dedicated officers the french eventually introduced a competent scoped rifle and a sniper training system as did the italians entering the war in 1917 the americans experienced rifle shortages but were able to build on their pre 1914 efforts to find a suitable sniping weapon the country that suffered most grievously was russia russian troops fielded no snipers at all and suffered accordingly featuring full colour artwork carefully chosen archive images and photographs of the sniping rifles and accessories used in the trenches this is the inside story of the rifles carried by snipers of all the major powers during world war i

quickly i climbed up to the surface and immediately found the rope i felt no signal so it was not safe yet then i felt three distinct tugs and slowly popped my head up the nearest goonbox was at least 200 feet away but indeed i was twenty feet from the edge of the woods bram vanderstok a born raconteur his escapes his operations as a spitfire pilot his experiences as a prisoner of war and his

incredible escape crossing the pyrenees all are described in a breathtaking manner which made me read his book through in one sitting prof dr l de jong founder director of the dutch institute for war documentation such a modest man such a dramatic story you ll be pulled into this absorbing account jonathan vance the true story of the great escape on the night of 24 march 1944 bram vanderstok was number 18 of 76 men who crawled beyond the barbed wire fence of stalag luft iii in zagan poland the 1963 film the great escape was largely based on this autobiography but with vanderstok s agreement filmmakers chose to turn his story into an australian character name sedgwick played by james coburn his memoir sets down his wartime adventures before being incarcerated in stalag luft iii and then in extraordinary detail describes various escape attempts which culminated with the famous march breakout after escaping vanderstok roamed curope for weeks passing through leipzig utrecht brussels paris dijon and madrid before making it back to england he reported to the air ministry and two months after escaping on 30 may 1944 he returned to the british no 91 squadron in the following months he flew almost every day to france escorting bombers and knocking down v1 rockets in august 1944 he finally returned to his home he learned that his two brothers had been killed in concentration camps after being arrested for resistance work his father had been tortured and blinded by the gestapo during interrogation he had never betrayed his son

the lee enfield is one of the 20th century s most recognisable and longest serving military rifles it was adopted by the british army in 1895 and only replaced by the 11a1 slr in 1957 it saw combat from the boer war onwards and thousands are still in use today it is estimated that 17 million have been produced soldier s recollections of the rifle are overwhelmingly affectionate it was known as the smellie today it remains a very popular target rifle for competitive shooting and modern copies are being manufactured to meet demand featuring first hand accounts brand new full colour artwork and close up photographs this is the story of the lee enfield the innovative reliable and long lived rifle that equipped british and other forces through the world wars and beyond
