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designed to meet the needs of the two year theory curriculum for music majors this straightforward market leading text emphasizes practicality and ease of use for both the student and the instructor its outstanding ancillaries which include a collection of audio examples on cd for both the text and workbook finale workbook software and an extensive instructor s manual round out the comprehensive teaching package

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focusing on the music of the great song composers schubert schumann brahms wolf and strauss poetry into song offers a systematic introduction to the performance and analysis of lieder part i the language of poetry provides chapters on the themes and imagery of german romanticism and the methods of analysis for german romantic poetry part ii the language of the performer deals with issues of concern to performers texture temporality articulation and interpretation of notation and unusual rhythm accents and stresses part iii provides clearly defined analytical procedures for each of four main chapters on harmony and tonality melody and motive rhythm and meter and form the concluding chapter compares different settings of the same text and the volume ends with several appendices that offer text translations over 40 pages of less accessible song scores a glossary of technical terms and a substantial bibliography directed toward students in both voice and theory and toward all singers the authors establish a framework for the analysis of song based on a process of performing listening and analyzing designed to give the reader a new understanding of the reciprocal interaction between performance and analysis emphasizing the masterworks the book features numerous poetic texts as well as a core repertory of songs examples throughout the text demonstrate points while end of chapter questions reinforce concepts and provide opportunities for directed analysis while there are a variety of books on lieder and on german romantic poetry none combines performance musical analysis textual analysis and the interrelation between poetry and music in the systematic thorough way of poetry into song

analysis of 18th and 19th century musical works in the classical tradition is a textbook for upper level undergraduate and graduate courses in music analysis it outlines a process of analyzing works in the classical tradition by uncovering the construction of a piece of music the formal harmonic rhythmic and voice leading organizations as well as its unique features it develops an in depth approach that is applied to works by composers including haydn mozart beethoven schubert schumann and brahms the book begins with foundational chapters in music theory starting with basic diatonic harmony and progressing rapidly to more advanced topics such as phrase design phrase expansion and chromatic harmony the second part contains analyses of complete musical works and movements the text features over 150 musical examples including numerous complete annotated scores suggested assignments at the end of each chapter guide students in their own musical analysis

provide s a historical analytical approach to the study of theory and harmony and accomplishes this in an informal and practical style the philosophy underlying all facets of the book is simply stated although theory in the abstract is important it is the practical application of theoretical principles that is the day to day business of most professional musicians analysis is the first step in understanding the use of tonal materials and style differences four basic parameters of music melody harmony rhythm and form are

emphasized another area of emphasis in this text is stylistic composition preface

this text begins with a species approach to counterpoint supported by a simultaneous synthesis of the resources of 18th century harmony graded exercises seek to unify the principles of counterpoint and harmony in an expanding craft chapters on melodic transformation and variation invertible counterpoint imitation and canon follow the introductory section and these chapters are in turn followed by chapters addressing the harmonic melodic and formal organization of model 18th century works the last chapters cover in order guided original composition in two part invention chorale prelude three voice fugue passacaglia and double fugue form

this step by step introduction to interpreting bass lines upper parts and whole compositions uses the new multi level hierarchy to show readers the interaction of structure and motion in music the authors present scores of models for notation and offer a host of exercises which are keyed to chapters or sections of chapters in addition lists of optional exercises keyed to commonly used anthologies are also supplied content highlights presents bass line sketches to allow a smooth transition into schenkerian analysis details the link between schenkerian analysis and traditional methods of analysis of form in music uses a generative top down approach to schenkerian analysis rather than a reductive approach to more clearly illustrate schenker's original intentions for the method devotes an entire section to the special topic of nontraditional tonal music before bach and after brahms and offers an encapsulated overview of the principal concepts of schenker's method to facilitate recall

this introduction to the theories and analytical approaches of contemporary western art music focuses primarily on pitch but also treats rhythm and meter texture and form analyses of three songs exemplifying distinct modes of pitch organization functional tonality atonality and neotonicity engage students helping them understand the implications of what they have learned williams covers the fundamentals of set theory and then expands on these fundamentals in chapters on diatonicism symmetrical sets neotonicity free atonality and serialism the author also explores more recent compositional techniques such as chance and indeterminacy minimalism and eclecticism

analyzes shilluk western nilotic southern sudan using an autosegmental approach based on lexical phonology

this single volume covers all the topics typically taught in a two year music theory course in addition to numerous self tests and examples musical illustrations with commentaries coverage of late 19th and 20th century developments and a companion workbook this updated edition includes a cassette with many of the text s musical examples new exercises summaries and self tests and an expanded supplements package a study guide 0 07 034882 6 and an enhanced instructor s manual 0 07 035881 8 with a chapter quiz and answers to workbook exercises are also available

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
